
# AuthorAID on-line courses in Mexico and Latin America

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
#### Introduction

The on-line AuthorAID Research Writing course was translated to Spanish to provide training for researchers in Latin America who may not be proficient in English.

• The Pilot course ran in Oct-Nov. 2014, with participants from the College of Biological Sciences (FCB), UANL, Mexico



• The AuthorAID-Latindex course ran in June 2015 with participants from 15 countries in Latin America and Europe.



### Training outcomes

Pre-course test average	5.95	6.04
Post-course test average	8.2	8.47

#### Key lessons learnt

- Research writing courses in Spanish are in great demand, especially among graduate students and early-career researchers.
- After the course, participants feel motivated to publish.
- Discussion forums and activities are considered useful and interesting.
- Completion of peer-evaluation activities causes anxiety among participants—instructions and expectations must be clear.
- Due dates and evaluation criteria must be clearly stated. Some flexibility can be applied, but enforcement should be consistent.
- Participants expect individual feedback from facilitators even though it is not feasible because of course constraints.
- There should be a way to inform organizers of publications derived from the course or other indicators of success.

## Future plans

- Acquire and set-up a Moodle server for the FCB
- Implement blended course as part of the graduate curriculum in the FCB
- Offer course in other colleges and institutions
